SHOW RULES

1. This show is affiliated with the Royal Agricultural Society of New Zealand and now runs under the RAS rules of showing.
2. **Yellow Card – This Show supports the RAS ‘Yellow Card’ System.**
A Yellow Card will be issued, In cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the ‘Yellow Card’ system is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.
3. **Forbidden Substance** – The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible’s risk. Forbidden Substance – Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardiovascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musoskeletal or urogenital systems,
4. **Arrears** – No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.
5. **Summary of RAS Resolution Process** – the full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official the show may request the assistance or RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.
6. **RAS Equestrian Levy** is incorporated into the class entry fee.
7. The Organizing Committee accepts no liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to Horses, Owners, Handlers, Grooms or Spectators, or to any other personal property whatsoever.
8. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate animal legislation and Health and Safety Employment Act 1992
9. All animals to be registered with their respective Breed societies where sections require this.
REGISTRATION NUMBERS ARE TO BE WRITTEN ON ENTRY FORM.
10. Registration Certificates and Height Certificates may be asked for where applicable.
11. Starting times will be adhered to as closely as possible. ONE CALL ONLY.
12. **Stallions & Colts**
 - a. **All stallions and colts** (with the exception of Miniature horse and foals) must be **shown in a bit**.
 - b. A steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses/ponies from the ring without recourse from the Stallion/colt’s owner/exhibitor/competitor.
 - c. It is **compulsory for all stallions and colts**, except foals, to wear **two (2) official ‘S’ identification** badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring, ‘S’ badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESN; armband from RAS Head Office.
 - d. **Handlers of stallions/Colts** must wear an approved HI VIZ vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office
 - e. **Pony Stallions** must be led **by handlers 14yrs and over**.
 - f. **Stallions over 148cm** must be led by a handler **17yrs and over**.

13. Mares

- a. 'Dry' mare is a mare not to foal during the current show season (1 August to 31 July).
 - b. Mares shown in Brood Mare classes must have a foal at foot or present a veterinary certificate of pregnancy that includes a projected foaling date. Mares shown in the summer season without a foal at foot, would be expected (before Christmas) to be late foaling in the summer of autumn, or (after Christmas) to have weaned an early foal and be back in foal with a spring due date. Mare falling into either of the above categories should prove their eligibility with a veterinary certificate. Anything less will be unacceptable.
14. Foals under 3 weeks of age must not be exhibited. They must be led by separate handler.
 15. Any horses found in unpaid for stables/yards will be removed.
 16. Applicants for refunds must be made in writing accompanied by a Doctors/Veterinary certificate and received within 7 days from the date of show. Refunds will be made after the show at the committee's discretion with a maximum refund of 75% of fees paid.
 17. Unruly, lame or unwell animals will be required to leave the ring.
 18. NO DOGS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS. This is a venue requirement and will strictly be enforced.
 19. Stables/Covered Yards/Pens must be left clean.
 20. Competitors to clean up all manure from around Floats/ Trucks and place it in the bins provided.
 21. No temporary tape or rope fences to be erected on the show grounds.
 22. All protests must be in writing and submitted to the Protest Committee within thirty (30) minutes of the incident, together with a \$50 protest fee, this will be refunded if the protest is upheld. The decision of the Protest Committee will be final.
 23. Entry fees are per horse per class
 24. Three (3) or more entries to enable a breed ring to take place
 25. Organizing Committee and stewards retain the right to change the order of, alter or delete classes and merge sections.
 26. Prize Money will be paid out in Cheque four (4) weeks after the show.
 27. Donated product may be in place of prize money.

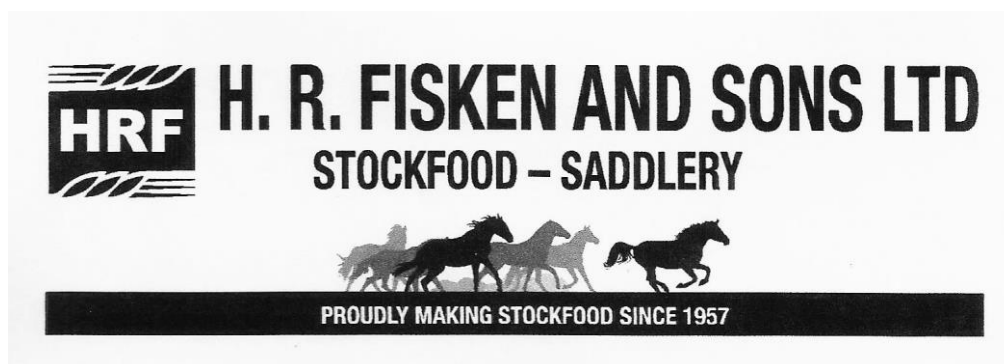

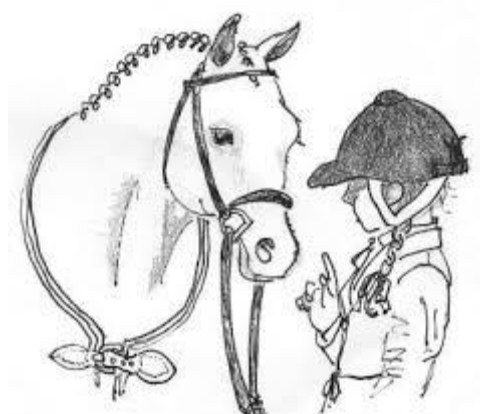

The Sportaloosa is an appaloosa coloured sport horse or pony bred to be user friendly and competitive in all disciplines. Sportaloosa's have ground covering movement and athletic ability to suit keen competitors, as well as a calm temperament and superb nature which makes them ideal for the weekend rider and the whole family.

Sportaloosa Horses can get their spots from the Appaloosa or Knabstrupper (and can be crossed to Warmblood, Thoroughbred, Arabian, Andalusian, Lusitano, Friesian, Lipizzaner, Stock Horse or Quarter Horse breeds).

Sportaloosa Ponies can get their spots from the Appaloosa, Knabstrupper, Palouse Ponies, or Miniature Appaloosas (and can be crossed to any of the above breeds as well as all pony breeds under 14hh).

Crosses to grey, classic roan, paint or pinto are not eligible.
